COVID (1919, 2020, 2021, and 2022)

The DGKA EOTC will present all types of viruses, their effects, and vaccines starting 2022.

### Viruses

1. **Pollio:** 1921 FR affected by polio and paralysis 1955 polio vaccine was discovered

2. **Smallpox:** Before smallpox was eradicated, it was a serious infectious disease caused by **the variola virus**. It was contagious—meaning, it spread from one person to another. People who had smallpox had a fever and a distinctive, progressive skin rash. Smallpox in 1970 from USA and 1986 from the world was eradicated

## Health Department

Everyone **five and older is now eligible to be vaccinated in Philadelphia.**

- Children between 5 and 11 can get the pediatric dose of the [Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine](#). A parent or guardian must be present.
- Teens from 12 to 17 can get the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine.
- Everyone 18 and over can get the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine, the [Moderna vaccine](#), or the [single-dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine](#).

Children can get vaccinated at City-run pop-up clinics, health centers, most pharmacies, and many pediatrician's offices.

## Booster shots

**Anyone 16 or older can get a booster dose after they've completed their COVID vaccine series.**

To get a booster, you'll need to show your vaccine card or a photo of your vaccine card. If you've lost your card, [you can request a replacement](#).

## Where and when

You can find free COVID-19 vaccines and booster shots in hundreds of locations throughout Philadelphia. You don't need to provide identification to get a vaccine.

## City-run pop-up vaccine clinics

The health department provides vaccines for adults and children at pop-up vaccine clinics all around the city. These clinics won't ask for proof of age or guardianship.

## City health centers

You can also get vaccines and boosters for children and adults at City health centers. Some locations provide appointments, while others offer walk-in hours. View the details for each location in the table.

## At home

You can also get your COVID-19 vaccine or booster at home. This program is for:

- People who are homebound.
- People who have disabilities or health issues that prevent them from leaving their home for a vaccine.
- Anyone who is having a hard time accessing the vaccine, including people with transportation and scheduling issues.

The Health Department believes that there are serious consequences for children and families when schools are only doing virtual learning. Research has shown this has led to a loss of educational opportunity as well as serious impacts on mental health and increased risk of other negative health consequences.

***Any students or staff who are fully vaccinated don't need to quarantine if they are exposed to a positive COVID case, provided they don't have symptoms and they should get tested five to seven days later. Last week 200,000 children affected by COVID 19***

However, ***unvaccinated staff and students must quarantine if they are exposed to a positive COVID case.*** That quarantine will last for **10 days**, or they can return after **seven days with a negative test taken on days five, six, or seven. CDC five days and five days wearing mask**

**If a student tests positive for COVID, the eight children sitting directly around them would be asked to quarantine, unless they are fully vaccinated.**

**If a classroom has three or more positive cases, the entire classroom would be asked to pause, and would be closed for up to ten days.**

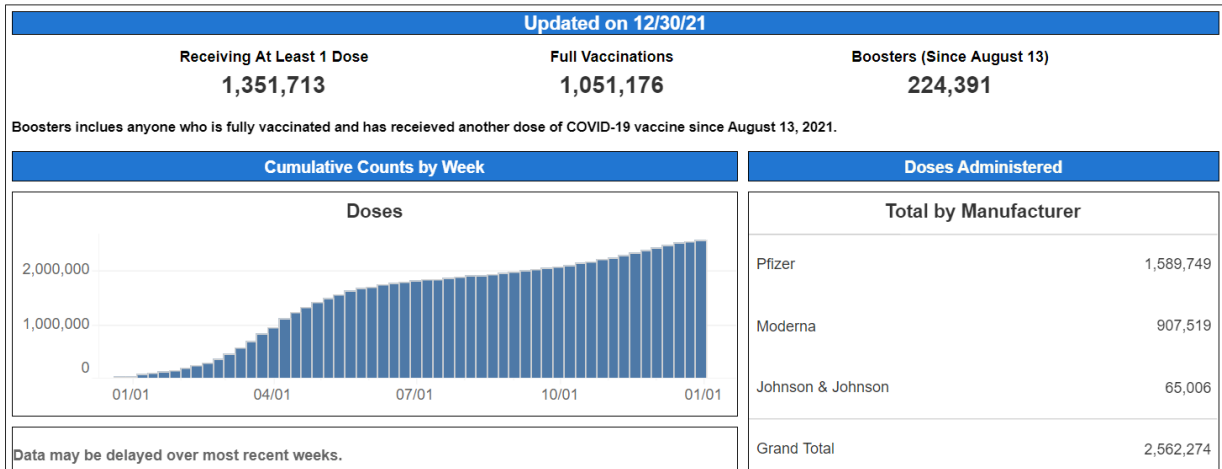
**If there are two or more classrooms or six cases in the same grade, the Health Department may recommend that the entire grade pause in-person learning and would be closed for up to ten days.**

**If there are three or more grades paused, or more than 3% of the entire school population has tested positive, the Health Department may recommend that the entire school pause in-person learning and would be closed for up to ten days.**

**Remember: fully vaccinated staff and students can continue in-person learning if quarantining due to one or two cases unless they have symptoms!**

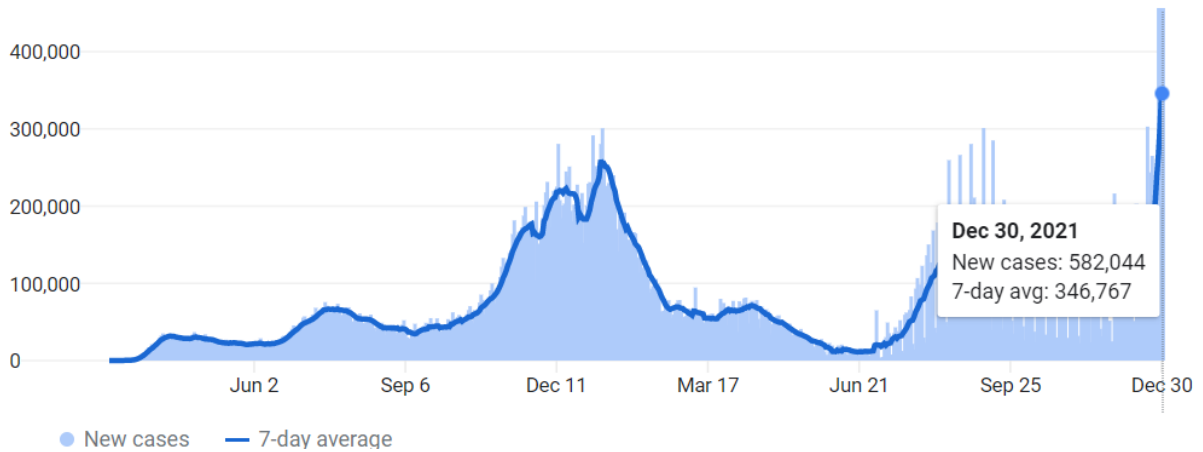
If you want your child to continue to be safe and continue to receive in-person education, get them fully vaccinated as soon as possible.

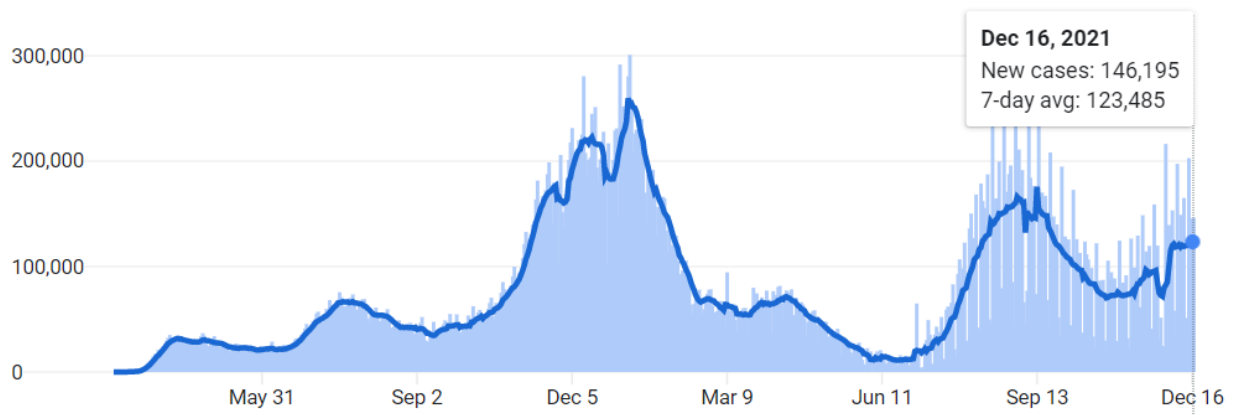
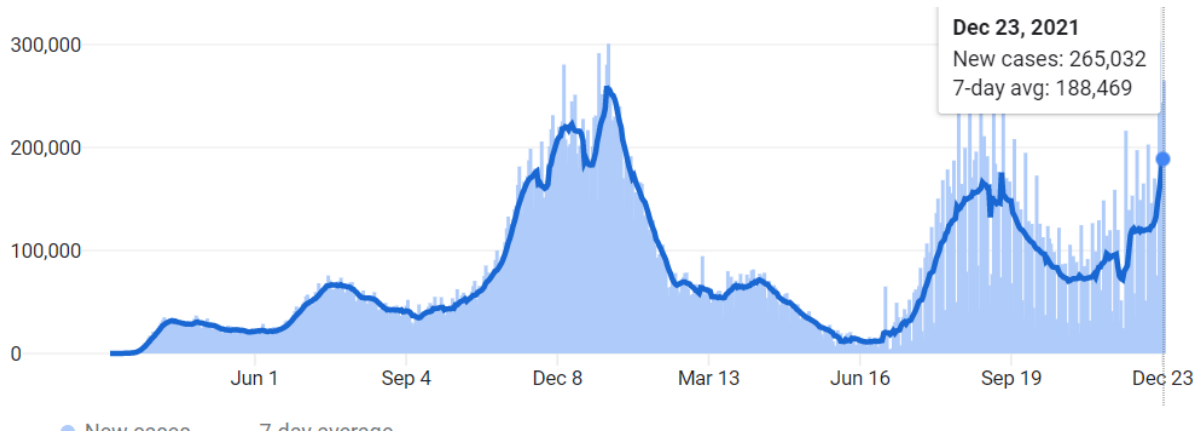
**Please vaccinate (five years and above)**
