Health Department

Younger kids in the Philly region are getting their COVID-19 vaccines, bringing long-awaited relief for parents (5-11 years old- 1 million/ 28 millions)



The Health Department has ordered tens of thousands of doses and will continue to order more to ensure that there is enough.

As the holidays get underway, health officials and experts say **COVID-19 testing will be crucial to managing the pandemic, even for those vaccinated.**

We're starting to see cases rise throughout the country. Pennsylvania is starting to see a real rise in cases. Testing is critical before and after gatherings and when you have symptoms.

Vaccination within 4 days: **36,143**

Fully Vaccinated = **1,008,076 (74.5%)**

One dose = **1,270,1130 (92.6 %)**

Hospitalized with COVID-19 are = **195**

On Ventilator = **23**

COVID-19 tests back positives = **2.6 %**

Positive with COVID 19/day = **254/day**

Total positives during the Pandemic = **174,401** (last week **169,839**)

Death from COVID 19 = **4,063**


Booster = **135,350**

5-11 years old vaccinated = **7%** in Philadelphia

I thought kids aren't getting sick from COVID-19.

In the most recent Delta wave this past summer, pediatric hospital admission rates were higher than they had been in any previous wave of the pandemic, reaching a rate of **25 hospitalizations per 100,000 per year in children between the ages of 5 to 11**. For the week ending October 28, 2021, **children were 24.2% of reported weekly COVID-19 cases** (children, under age 18, make up 22.2% of the US population), according to the [American Academy of Pediatrics](#). Getting kids 5-11 vaccinated now will help make sure fewer kids get sick from COVID-19!

Watch for ANY of the following symptoms of COVID-19:

- Fever or chills.
- Muscle or body aches.

- Headache.
- Sore throat.
- Congestion or runny nose.
- Fatigue.
- Nausea or vomiting.
- Diarrhea.
- New or persistent cough.
- New loss of taste or smell.
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing.

People with COVID-19 may **have no symptoms**. People with COVID-19 **can spread the disease to other people several days before they develop symptoms**.

-Please stay home if you feel sick or have a symptom

If you have had close contact with someone with COVID-19, **quarantine at home for 10 days**.

You may end quarantine after day 7 if you continue to be asymptomatic and receive a negative COVID-19 test 48 hours before you plan to end quarantine. After stopping quarantine, continue to **monitor symptoms until 14 days** after exposure.

If at any point you **develop symptoms of COVID-19 you should begin isolation**. Get tested if you can do so without coming into close contact with others. Take temperature measurement **101 degree F**

How you treat your self

- **Monoclonal antibodies against COVID-19 are a treatment given by infusion.**
- Most people who have had COVID-19 get better just by **resting, drinking fluids, and taking fever medicine like Tylenol/acetaminophen.**
- If you have trouble breathing, worsening cough, chest pain or pressure, new confusion, inability to wake or stay awake, or bluish lips or face, call your doctor's office, go to an urgent care clinic, or go to an emergency department. Call first if you can, so they are expecting you.
- There are several medications that have been found to improve outcomes in people with severe disease including steroids and antiviral medications. These are given in the hospital.


Please vaccinate (five years and above)
