Weekly COVID-19 Response Level: This week's COVID-19 response level is Level 1: **"All Clear"** means no mask requirement except for healthcare center, congregate. **But those who are unvaccinated required to wear double mask and those who are in high-risk people.** But the mandate for Mask might change next week that indoor mandate for mask might implementing.

What will be required to reach All Clear Status?

All Clear Status

- Average new daily case count is under **100**
- Hospitalizations are under **50**
- Positivity is under **2%**
- Cases have not risen by more than 50% within the past 10 days

Current Status

3.1-4.3 %

There would be a 1-week mask requirement after spring break to avoid a post-break surge in cases.

There are still places where masks will be required, namely healthcare settings (including our Health Centers), public transit, congregate living settings.

Finally, some people might still want extra protection against COVID and will wear masks while they're around others. There's nothing wrong with this and these people do not deserve harassment. Some may have a family **member that is at high-risk**, some may be sick and are actually protecting you, and some may just want to be safe. All of those, and more, are valid reasons to keep wearing masks.

- The city was averaging **94/day positive result this week.**
- **48 hospitalized this week.**
- The positivity rate is **3.1-4.3 %** this week.

We must continue to protect ourselves and each other by getting **vaccinated, testing** if we don't feel well, and taking care to protect the **vulnerable people in our communities.**"

Health Officials Warn Philadelphians to Start Taking Precautions Against COVID

The average number of Philadelphians testing positive for COVID-19 has been **slowly rising** over the last several weeks.

This recommendation follows early warnings to get ready in case a new COVID-19 **wave comes to Philadelphia.**

"The Health Department has been warning that, based on what we've seen in Europe, **we could see another COVID-19 wave sooner rather than later.**

Now, cases in Philadelphia are slowly rising and have increased by **more than 50 percent in the last ten days.**

As we see more cases of COVID-19 in the city, **everyone's risk goes up.** That means that now is the time to start taking precautions. It's not required yet, but Philadelphians should strongly **consider wearing a mask** while in public indoor spaces. Make sure you have a supply of masks and home tests ready in case you need them. And if you haven't gotten up-to-date on your COVID-19 vaccine, there's still time to do that and help protect yourself and your community today."


COVID-19 Response Level: This week's COVID-19 response level is All Clear. This means there is **no vaccine requirement for places that serve food or drink. Masks are not required in indoor public places.**

Masks are still required in healthcare settings, congregate living settings, and on transit. Businesses and other institutions are allowed to be more strict than the City's COVID-19 Response Levels, so some businesses may require proof of vaccination or that everyone wears a mask.
